Discuss Real Estate and Possible Industry Moving into the Industrial Park:

Mayor Thomas introduced Spencer Hogg and let him introduce the gentleman from Johnson Energy Solutions. Randy Johnson, President, Dale Barnett, Vice President, and Wesley Johnson, Technical Analyst, all together they gave a presentation to explain the project. They will be producing renewable energy through the anaerobic digestion of chicken litter. The company will be producing pipeline quality renewable natural gas and

sustainable fertilizers. Randy Johnson went on to say they would like to purchase 60 acres in the Trion Industrial Park. The estimated total investment will be approximately \$62 million and will employ 30 people. This project will take approximately 18 months to 2 years to complete.
